

ST MARY'S CEMETERY

St Mary's colony was established by patriarch Joseph Ehmann, who arrived in the third wave of settlers in 1893. Plans to build a church were soon underway. A large store in Regina was bought and dismantled for the price \$200.00. The lumber was hauled to St Mary's colony and the church was built in the summer of 1895. It was moved to to Riceton in 1941 and became known as Sacred Heart church.

St Mary's colony seemed to have broken up after the death of patriarch Joseph Ehmann. He was known as "der fromme Yosef" (devout) . Four of his great grand sons became priests and nine granddaughters choose religious life. Bishop Don Bolen is the great grand son of Josef Ehmann.

the cairn at St Mary's cemetery was erected and dedicated at a Thanksgiving mass on August 1st, 1971. The cemetery existed during the years of 1892-1921. The original size of the cemetery was 124' x 92'.
